<u>Business Meeting:</u> Minutes from June 28, 2024, meeting were distributed at the meeting. Catherine made a motion to accept, Larry seconded, all approved.

Committee Reports:

<u>Finance</u>: Vice President Leigh Shaffer reported that there is approximately \$12,000.00 in the checking account. Leigh also reported that HHHS received about \$1,800.00\$ in donations in Memory of Margaret's son, James. Thank you letters have been sent to all donors. Leigh has offered to continue to handle the financials until Margaret is ready to reassume her position.

Fundraising: Catherine distributed the 50/50 Raffle tickets to those in attendance. Catherine explained that each member will receive 6 books, 30 tickets per member. If anyone would like more (or less) tickets, please contact Margaret. Cash or check for payment. Checks can be made payable to HHHS. Margaret will collect all monies for the raffle. Catherine thanked Margaret for creating the spreadsheet and dividing all of the tickets for members to sell.

He was inquiring about Cowboy City & Jersey Jungle.

<u>New Business</u>: Members discussed hosting a flea market at Ardena Schoolhouse on Saturday, October 5th. Catherine will check with Allaire's Flea Market date and other possible conflicts.

Lynn mentioned the Township of Ocean Historical Museum is an organization we should try to emulate. They do a variety of events to "drum up" interest in the community. Catherine agreed that they have a good website, great email content and informative newsletter. We should be looking towards doing events that will expose our buildings to the community.

Catherine noted that the Sea Girt Lighthouse hosts an art show every summer. The lighthouse does not do anything except provide the space. The turnout is great and is excellent public relations.
