HHHS Meeting Minutes June 23, 2023

The meeting was opened by Ann Malsbury, Vice President with the Flag Salute, and a moment of silence. She introduced the program WWII Ost Front presented by Jude Meehan.

The May Treasurer's Report was accepted with a motion to approve by Catherine Schwier and seconded by Vicky Arose. All in favor. The May Secretary's Report was accepted with a motion to approve by Virginia Wooley and seconded by Larry Lastra. All in favor.

Business meeting: Ann Malsbury requested that the committees and subcommittees report monthly. Ways and Means; The three recent fundraisers at Jersey Mike's, Bubbakoos and Shivers raised \$400. The status of the coffee sales was discussed. Orders may be made online or by phone. Margaret Winkelman sent a report on the June 5 meeting at the Schoolhouse with the Questor group. There was genuine interest in the Schoolhouse and they made a \$50 donation in addition to raffle ticket sales and some items being purchased.

<u>Buildings and Grounds:</u> Jude Meehan discussed the difficulty in working on the MacKenzie House due to lack of access. There was discussion as to who needs the codes. Lynn Barrall made a motion to give access to MacKenzie to Jude Meehan and Bill Shaffer. Catherine Schwier seconded. All in favor. There was also discussion as to how to coordinate access with John Wooley who handles the water at MacKenzie.

Virginia Wooley is trying to get paint donations from Home Depot for the interior of the Schoolhouse. She needs a letter with HHHS letterhead. There was discussion of the need for an analysis of the interior paint prior to the start of any painting. Dave Duarte will be painting the belfry as soon as weather and his schedule allow.

<u>Antique Sale:</u> Volunteers needed for both days. Leigh Shaffer and Lily Keaney priced all the items and arranged them at the Schoolhouse. The presale items raised \$888.

<u>New Business:</u> There was damage at the Schoolhouse which turned out to be the result of a car accident. There was some structural damage to one pillar, shrubs and several picnic tables were demolished. A Police report was filed. We need an estimate for the damages which should be covered by the car insurance. DPW needs to know HHHS owns the buildings for any future incidents. There are no bids yet for Schoolhouse HVAC installation.

Leigh Shaffer reported on MacKenzie House. The porch is sinking, the foundation is deteriorating and there are problems with the drainage system. Brian McIlvaine provided an estimate of approx. \$50,000. The need for an architect was discussed. Dave Duarte gave an estimate of approx. \$24,000 to repair the back of the house, prepare and paint the house, and glaze the windows. That amount would also include the out buildings. We still need a roof estimate, which will be more than the Schoolhouse. It was agreed the costs will probably be higher. The building is in worse shape than when we acquired it. Jude Meehan agreed to look at MacKenzie and report at the July meeting.

It was also noted that the date of the raffle drawing had to be changed from August 27 to August 6. The change should be indicated on the raffle tickets.

Bill Shaffer made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Vicky Arose. All in favor.
